Summary

The Lakewood High School IBPA is here to support all IB and IB prep students and their families.

The anonymous survey was open from December 19, 2018 to February 2, 2019, and was accessible via links in the December, 2018 IBPA newsletter, email reminders, a QR code distributed at the January, 2019 general meeting, and the IBPA website.


92 respondents provided feedback (~18% response rate). Multiple answers were allowed and questions could be skipped.


Significant input and feedback was received – thank you!


Next Steps

Not until a budget and financials are given to members


Depends on time of year

With all due respect, the IB program is still somewhat a mystery for our family. There ought to be recommended curriculum and guidance on the internet.

Shared in previous boxes... as parents of a freshman Pre-IB we wish we had more information on how to prepare for IB program. We didn't get good guidance on what courses to take this year and what to prepare for next year before IB.

More information on the website on recommended courses, and curriculum pathways. This could eliminate emails of "is honors History ok or must be APUSH?" etc. When to take PE, etc., etc., etc. For instance, the graphic that Mr. Bock passed out for the new prospective parents might be useful on the website, too.

Honestly, I feel like IBPA is not helpful until you are already in the IB program as a junior. There needs to be more information freshman and sophomore year explaining the program and benefits. Also, a very real honest presentation on what the program entails and sacrifices that need to be made. For example: giving up your off periods, limited elective choices, which colleges do not accept credit, etc.

Overview of annual budget

The budget should be sent to members as well as monthly financials

Would love to see a budget presented to members who have joined. Lots of fundraising but no transparency on budget.

I was heavily involved during K-8 and don't really see the need for that level of support in high school. Or, perhaps I'm just burned out on all of it . More specifics of how money is spent or fundraisers with specific direct spends are always helpful.

Email communications could be a bit more streamlined maybe, but then again I need all the help I can get keeping up with too many school emails! Also, my daughter is never able to go to the IBPA evenings meetings - an alternative to get her more engaged would be great.
